President's message

Greetings Gardening Friends,

Hope you enjoyed the presentation by David Toth on his work blending Space Age iris features with Broken Color iris. Four lucky folks went home with gift certificates for some of his iris.

This month we will be meeting on the **second Tuesday**, **May 14**, and hearing from Gus Guzinski of Kalamazoo, MI. He'll be presenting, "How daylilies grow and divide". Gus is a retired research chemist who's been a member of the American Daylily Society for over 30 years. He's been especially interested in the genetics of color inheritance and unusual genetic traits in daylilies. For the past several years he's been working on early bloom in daylilies, getting daylilies to bloom in June rather than July in his area of Michigan. Planting about 3000 seeds a year, he's working on foliage types, scape branching patterns, as well as other traits of interest. He has introduced five daylilies from his work. Come and hear about the mystery of how daylilies grow and divide.

Our Iris Show will be on Saturday, May 18 at the Judge Stone House, 107 S 8th St, Noblesville, IN. This will be in connection with the Peony Festival which will be held in the same general area. Set up will be from 8-10:30am with judging thereafter. The show will be open to the public from 1-4pm. The show information and guidelines were attached to the April newsletter and are again attached to this newsletter. There will be tags available at our www.indianadaylilyirissociety.com May meeting. This will be a great opportunity to educate the public about iris. Please consider bringing some iris to exhibit in order to make our show a success.

MORE ABOUT-James (Gus) Guzinski is a retired research chemist whose field of expertise is natural flavor and natural color. He is an expert on chili peppers. After his early retirement from industry, he taught chemistry and has since retired again. He published the first report identifying lycopene as the carotenoid pigment responsible for the melon colored daylily flower.

He has been an AHS member for more than 30 years. He was Region 2 Newsletter editor several years ago and also written several popularized science article for the newsletter and for the Daylily Journal. In the past he served on the Registration Committee for AHS and is now on the Scientific Studies Committee. He is also a garden judge and a popular garden judge instructor.

His interests in hybridizing are heavily weighted toward the genetics of color inheritance and to the study of unusual genetic traits in daylilies. For the past several years he has been working predominantly for early bloom in daylilies. In his display gardens in Kalamazoo, MI, peak bloom is third week in July but, in his seedlings beds, peak season occurs in June. "I can't wait until July each summer to see daylilies bloom." He finds working for something different more satisfying than working on the hot trends in daylilies.

He has no interest in becoming a commercial daylily hybridizer and rarely registers his seedlings. "Five named cultivars in 30 years seem enough." This should not be taken to mean that his hybridizing program is small. He plants about 3,000 seeds a year with about one quarter of those dedicated to projects to study foliage types, scape branching patterns, and other traits of interest. Most of his hybridizing uses diploids because the genetics are simpler and there is more variety available.

His garden is a piece of his acreage, "just enough to be too much." Display cultivars are grown in raised wood beds near a small pond that often has baby turtles. His acre of seedlings is nearby and is open to garden visitors by appointment. The best time to visit is late June when he has thousands of seedlings in bloom but almost no bloom until a month later in his display bed of registered cultivars.
