Next year the ADS Region 2 summer meeting will be held in Lafayette. Many of us will be involved with that event. Our club will be selling daylilies and iris at the meeting with plant contributions from many of you. The AIS Region 6 summer meeting will be held at Sutter's farm in May. A motion was made and seconded at our June meeting to postpone our 2025 Daylily Show until 2026 in light of the ADS Region 6 Summer meeting and the AIS Region 2 Summer meeting being held in the Lafayette area in 2025 with many club members being involved in the planning/coordinating. Greg Beavers and Lezlie Myers expressed willingness to coordinate a show in 2025 if the club wanted to proceed. Don't forget the AIS Region 6 Fall meeting on September 21 in Avilla, IN. Let me know if you need registration information. There will be one hour of judge's training and a one hour presentation of the 2024 AIS National Convention which was held in Oregon.

We will also have an area for the free plant exchange at our September meeting. If you are dividing clumps of something and have extra, bring them along to share. If you have garden related items you no longer want, bring them along.
